Once upon a time, in a roadstead outside a harbour entrance, and even when anchored in bays, yachts could just be made out by their anchor lights, the gleaming lan-

terns of large sailing boats, thanks to the portholes in the crew cabins or the interior lighting in the saloon and deckhouse. That is a thing of the past and changed about ten years ago. For some time

now a complete niche industry has been engaged in the effective illumination of yachts. Lighting manufacturers and stylists of interiors and exteriors plan refined scenarios; because thanks to carefully ap-

plied light, the features of the yacht can be emphasised. Spots in the rigging simplify the counting of the pairs of spreaders, accentuate the vertical dimensions and give the rigging a festive look.
